You'll play a key role in creating, curating, and amplifying multimedia stories of faith and moral courage across multiple platforms. You'll be writing, reporting, editing, fact-checking, brainstorming, pitching, celebrating -- and anything else you can think of that happens in the newsroom of a modern online media outlet.

This position is flexible with a maximum of 20 hours per week. Strong preference for individuals based in New York City, able to come into the office for at least part of the work week.

Responsibilities:

- Writing/editing stories on the *Voices* and other platforms at Auburn Seminary
- Producing social media content for Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, and Instagram
- Using digital tools, including Wordpress, to implement and format multi-media articles
- Pitching features and managing the editorial calendar

Skills and Requirements:

- Strong interest and/or experience in faith-based media, social justice, and journalism
- One to two years of experience in a related field such as writing or editing online content and/or a graduate degree in journalism or related fields
- Knowledge of social media practices and tactics
- Excellent spelling and grammar
- Knowledge and experience with multimedia storytelling
- Knowledge and experience using Wordpress
- Ability to work fast on a small team while juggling multiple projects
- Photo and video editing skills a plus
- An appreciation and curiosity of the roles religion and spirituality can play in movements for justice is important.
